1. Program Direction – 50%

  - b. Manage Core Programs
    - i. Counseling – oversee insurance program
    - ii. Support groups – at center and in schools
    - iii. Grief camp
    - iv. Memorial services and family workshops
  - c. Grant funded programs
    - i. Provide data and updates to Grant Coordinator as needed
2. Community Outreach – 20%
  - a. Education and training – increase CEU presentations in the community
  - b. Partnerships to increase referrals
  - c. Grant opportunities
    - i. Identify additional sources of grant funding
  - d. Develop volunteer program
  - e. Develop clinical internship program



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3. Caseload – 20%
  - a. Carry a small caseload of clients seeking counseling
  - b. Facilitate support groups if needed
  - c. Objective is to continue to build program, not act as primary counselor
  
4. Mission Cultivation – 10%
  - a. Prioritize strategic initiatives
  - b. Create timeline / milestones to accomplish quarterly goals
  - c. Team meetings

All applicants must have a master's degree and be an independently licensed in Counseling (PCC-S) or Social Work (LISW-S) with at least 3 years of Clinical Supervisory experience. Direct counseling and group work experience; bereavement experience; and the ability to lead a team and build a program, 40 hours per week.
